PROFESSIONAL HOCKEY BACK IN QUÉBEC Kings' training camp in Quebec in two weeks

Québec, Monday, September 16, 2024 -- It's in two weeks that hockey fans will have the chance to see the Los Angeles Kings in action as they will arrive in Québec who will arrive in Quebec to hold the last part of their training camp. Their last two preseason games, Thursday, October 3rd against the Boston Bruins and Saturday, October 5th against the Florida Panthers, will be played on the ice of the Videotron Center. During their stay in Québec, players will participate in various activities included in the program.

The involvement of the Kings' players in various community activities will allow fans and young kids to see their idols up close and demonstrate their passion and appreciation for hockey. Before the game on Thursday, October 3rd, hockey fans will be invited to pay a special tribute to Patrice Bergeron, as he will be travelling to Québec with his former teammates. Having grown up in Quebec, Patrice Bergeron is one of the greatest players from the area to have played in the National Hockey League. On Saturday, October 5th, spectators will have the privilege of watching nothing less than the Stanley Cup Champions, the Florida Panthers, play on the ice of the Videotron Center.

For the two games played as part of this training camp, all profits generated by the 50-5- sales will be donated to charities organizations of the Quebec area.

Kings will leave Québec on Sunday October 6th to continue their stay in the Province of Québec in Charlevoix before heading to Buffalo where they will play their first regular season game on Thursday, October 10th.

TICKETS AVAILABLE

As of today, more than 24,601 tickets in the stands had been sold on a total of 33,980 seats available for both games. Thus, 9,379 tickets remain on sale for these games. Including corporate suites ticket holders, current attendance is at 14 398 for Thursday's game and at 12,208 for Saturday's game. Tickets are still available on ticketmaster.ca or the Centre Vidéotron ticket office. Tickets' prices range is between \$55.00 and \$170.00 depending on seat availability.

To attend free practice sessions, open to public, fans are invited to come directly to the Videotron Center. This is a general admission access, on a first-come, first-served basis.

ABOUT THE VIDEOTRON CENTRE

The Videotron Centre is a multipurpose arena that opened on September 12, 2015. Multiple configurations make it suitable for major music concerts and sporting events alike, with seating for more than 18,000 for games and more than 20,000 for concerts. The Videotron Centre is the home of the Québec Remparts of the Quebec Major Junior Hockey League (QMJHL) and can also host professional hockey games as it meets National Hockey League (NHL) standards.
